Level 1 All major and minor scales (natural, harmonic, and melodic), parallel motion, 4 octaves in 16th notes: m.m. quarter note $=60$
Level 2 All major and minor scales and arpeggios, parallel motion, 4 octaves in 16 th notes: m.m. quarter note $=60$
Level 3 All scales and arpeggios as above: m.m. quarter note $=72$
Level $4 \quad$ All scales and arpeggios as above: m.m. quarter note $=84$
Level 4P All scales and arpeggios as above and broken major and minor triads: m.m. quarter note $=84$
Level $5 \quad$ All scales and arpeggios as above: m.m. quarter note $=92$
Level 5P All scales and arpeggios in contrary motion: m.m. quarter note $=92$
Level $6 \quad$ All scales and arpeggios as above: m.m. quarter note $=104$
Level 6P All scales in thirds, sixths, and tenths four octaves and arpeggios in octaves, parallel motion, all in 16th notes: m.m. quarter note $=104$
Level 7P All scales in octaves, parallel motion and major and minor triad arpeggios and dominant and diminished-seventh arpeggios, all 4 octaves in 16th notes: m.m. quarter note $=120$
*Levels 4P, 5P, 6P, and 7P apply only to Piano Performance and Performance/Pedagogy majors.
